








A Journey to Experience the History and Culture of Japanese Tea



Kyoto's tea-producing region, the birthplace of Japanese tea, spreads south of Kyoto City and produces high-quality matcha green tea, gyokuro (the finest grade of green tea), and many other varieties. Enjoy a journey through Japanese history and tea culture by visiting sites such as the birthplace of Nagatani Soen, where you can learn the history of Japanese tea, and Byodoin Temple, a World Heritage Site, and try matcha green tea sweets and hands-on experiences of Japanese tea culture.



Currently, the castle serves as a local history museum that features artifacts from the castle and surrounding areas. From the castle tower, you can see unobstructed views of the Fukuchiyama townscape.

This region is also home to Nagaoka-kyo, which was the capital of Japan from 784 to 794, as well as historical landmarks such as ancient burial mounds and the ruins of Nagaoka-kyo, Nagaoka Tenman-gu Shrine and other Buddhist temples and shrines, museums and more. A history that dates back to ancient times still lingers in this region.






